It delivers 1 st and 2d cycle diplomas of art, intended to train future artists, art professionals, teachers and researchers. Practice-based, it is a small school, with 180 students, including 20% of international students from all over the world.

FIRST CYCLE (Bachelor) → year 2	Autumn and/or spring term of year 2 30 ECTS per semester → First cycle exchange students (Bachelor / <u>undergraduate / 2d and 3d year students</u>) are included in <u>the 2d year program</u> , which encloses, per semester: - 1 interdisciplinary thematic project (pôle) - French (or English) - theoretical classes (history of arts, philosophy, aesthetics, culture) - two <i>ateliers</i> (practical work in our technical studios) - experimentation and research - conferences, workshops		
SECOND CYCLE (Master) → year 4	Autumn and/or spring semester of year 4 30 ECTS per semester → Second cycle exchange students (Master / graduate / 4th and 5 th year students) are included in the 4 th year program, which encloses, per semester: - 1 interdisciplinary project ("studio de recherche-création") - French (or English) - research seminar - access to the <i>ateliers</i> - thesis writing and methodology - conferences, workshops		
STUDENT ACCOMMODATION & SERVICES			
Accommodation and support	ESAAIX does not provide students with accommodation. It can offer students advice on how to find a room/flat during their stay, and put exchange students in touch with outgoing students to arrange flat swaps. Average price of a room in Aix: between 400 and 600 euros per month. A document is provided to international students to help prepare their stay (« International students study guide »). Special meetings are organized at the beginning of each term to welcome international students and show them around the school.		
LANGUAGE			
Are courses taught in English available?	All courses are taught in French. French classes are provided to International Students (free		



	of charge). Individual tutoring can be held in English, according to professors' capacity.	
Which level of French is recommended?	Fluent French (B1 level) is strongly recommended to attend courses and communicate with students and professors. However, students who speak no or little French can be accepted, if they demonstrate strong interest, motivation to learn French, capacity to adapt to a French-speaking environment.

Public sessions and exhibitions are organized to display students' work. ESAAIX is a member of various national and international networks, and collaborates with institutions in Aix, Marseille, Provence region and various cities in France. It hosts a research lab, LOCUS SONUS VITAE.
