ERASMUS+ Student Mobility

The ERASMUS+ higher education programme implements the EU's Lifelong Learning Programme and promotes, among other things, the mobility of students, lecturers and other university staff. It also promotes international cooperation between European universities. University of Fine Arts Muenster actively participates in the ERASMUS+ programme of the European Union in the areas of study, internship, teacher and staff mobility.

ERASMUS+ STUDY RESIDENCE

30 May: summer semester of the next year

30 November: winter semester of the next year

ERASMUS+ INTERNSHIP

Students of University of Fine Arts Muenster can apply for ERASMUS+ funding for internships in the EU countries, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway and Turkey. The funding currently amounts to between €445.00 and €555.00 per month, depending on the country group.

Internal application deadline Internship:

No later than 6 weeks before the start of the internship

DAAD Promos Student Mobility outside the EU PROMOS - Programme to increase the mobility of students from German universities

University of Fine Arts Muenster can award PROMOS scholarships for the following support measures worldwide:

- Study visits (1 to 6 months)
- Internships (6 weeks to 6 months)
- Language courses (3 weeks to 6 months)
- Specialised courses (up to 6 weeks)

The application deadline for a PROMOS scholarship for 2022 is 23 December 2021.

The PROMOS scholarship is funded by the Federal Ministry of Education and Research (BMBF). The scholarships are advertised and awarded subject to the allocation of funds by the DAAD; there is no legal entitlement to funding.

DAAD Prize

The Kunstakademie Münster awards the DAAD Prize of 1,000.00 euros to an outstanding international student or doctoral candidate who has distinguished himself/herself both through special academic achievements and remarkable social or intercultural commitment. Funding is provided by the German Federal Foreign Office (AA) through the DAAD's Combined Scholarship and Mentoring Programme (STIBET).

Requirements:

- foreign students enrolled in a regular degree programme; advanced studies
- Young foreign graduates who completed their degree no longer than 3 months ago
- Foreign doctoral candidates
- special academic achievements
- Proof of remarkable social or intercultural commitment

Applications:

- For each artistic class, the head of the class or the supervisor of doctoral students can submit a proposal.

Application documents:

- Proposal by the class leader or supervisor (form).
- Proof of notable social or intercultural commitment

Selection committee:

The selection is made by a committee consisting of representatives of the Rectorate and the Department of Academic and Student Affairs.

The DAAD Prize is announced separately each year by the university.

The scholarships are advertised and awarded subject to the allocation of funds by the DAAD; there is no legal entitlement to funding.

DAAD Study Graduation Scholarships

University of Fine Arts Muenster awards scholarships from the German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD) for foreign students who are completing their artistic examinations at the academy. The partial scholarship rates are subject to funding by the DAAD and associated grant agreements with the Münster Art Academy. In general, funding of at least 250.00 euros for a maximum of 3 months is sought.

Requirements:

- Foreign students (foreign students who have acquired their higher education entrance qualification or other previous school education abroad).
- enrolled in a regular course of study at University of Fine Arts Muenster (no guest/exchange students)
- good academic performance
- successful completion of studies expected within one year (exam registration)

Application documents:

- Application form
- Statement of the artistic class director
- academic achievements (please apply for a Transcript of Records at the Student Services)

Selection committee:

The selection is made by a commission consisting of representatives of the Rectorate and the Department of Academic and Student Affairs.

Deadlines:

Applications are possible until 31.03 and 31.08.
